Upward Bound supports the belief that every person is important, created by God, worthy of love and caring service. Camp gives every person the opportunity to realize and share their gifts and individual special abilities.

As a camp volunteer you will have the opportunity to meet new people, gain important leadership skills and receive valuable training to take with you as you begin your professional life. Students will assist Program staff in providing a personal, fun and safe camp experience to campers.

We believe all people, regardless of their level of ability, can benefit greatly by experiencing the outdoors in a barrier-free environment. We offer all of the activities traditional to any summer camp in a way that makes them accessible to campers of any level of ability. Camper activities include: Fishing, Horseback Riding, Swimming, Archery, Canoeing, Camp Fire, Nature Walks and More!

If selected, students will be placed on one of the following sessions to complete service work. Students are responsible for transportation to and from camp. Upward Bound Camp is located near Lyons, OR, 45 miles east of Salem, OR.

PURPOSE OF POSITION: To provide opportunities for training as a camp counselor, sharing recreation with disabled persons in a Christian camp environment. To act as an assistant to Senior Camp Counseling staff in providing a personal, fun and safe camp experience to campers assigned.

QUALIFICATIONS: Must be at least 16 years of age
Interested in camp/outdoor recreation
Wanting to serve others
Willing to learn and accept role as a team member
Good health and stamina
No criminal history related to abuse of persons
Three verifiable, non-relative references

RESPONSIBLE TO: Camp Directors and Program staff as assigned.

GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES:

Primary role is to assist Camp Counselors in providing a safe, enjoyable and personal camp experience to campers

1. Participate as a team member with a willingness to learn, grow, serve, meet new challenges and contribute to the total camp success
2. Maintain a behavior model for campers in word, deed, dress, and attitude
3. Assist in camp chores as needed to keep camp running smoothly and safely
4. Practice State and camp procedures, policies and guidelines as trained, avoiding unnecessary risk taking, and placing safety as a priority
5. Report all illness, injury, accidents, or near accidents to Senior Camp Counselor assigned or Camp Director
6. Properly use and care for equipment, reporting all equipment needs, damages, hazards or inappropriate use to Senior Camp Counselor assigned or director
7. Take emergency actions as trained when needed
8. Keep physically fit by proper eating, sleeping and time management
9. Communicate problems, concerns, questions and suggestions to team members
10. Complete assigned training and attend staff meetings
11. Share talents, experience and abilities for the benefit of others at camp
12. Enjoy the fun of camp, time with God, time with others, time learning/serving

Upward Bound Camp is a program independent of Jesuit High School. Summary The purpose of Upward Bound Camp is to provide on-going Christian based recreational and educational camp experiences for persons with disabilities, twelve years of age and over in an environment that presents opportunities for growth outside the individual's usual routine or habitat. The duties of a volunteer will be to meet the campers' needs and ensure they have a good time throughout the week. This is done in coordination and cooperation with the Program staff, who will serve as supervisors for volunteers in coordination with camp directors. Volunteers may live in cabins or tents with campers with disabilities and other staff members.

My daughter or son is in average to good health for a person her or his age, with no limiting physical condition. There will be no smoking, drinking of alcohol or use of other drugs allowed at camp. I realize that if my son or daughter breaks the established rules and is posing a serious threat to his or her safety, the safety of any camper or staff member, or to the success of the experience, my son or daughter will be sent home at parent's expense, and will receive no credit toward the Christian Service Requirement at Jesuit High School.

Volunteer Code of Conduct

As an Upward Bound Camp volunteer, I agree that while serving as a volunteer, I will:

- Make safety a priority. Report any emergencies or safety concerns to the appropriate manager.
- Dress and act in an appropriate manner and use language that will not offend others.
- Follow the established rules and instruction provided to me by Upward Bound Camp or volunteer leaders.
- Abstain from the consumption or use of all alcohol, tobacco products and illegal substances while involved with any Upward Bound Camp programming.
- Treat everyone respectfully regardless of race, religion, color, age, gender or disability.
- Act with courtesy, sensitivity, tact, and consideration.
- Be truthful, honest and act with integrity.
- Be attentive to the task at hand and respectful of those around you by muting or turning off your cell phone or other electronic devices.

Volunteer Agreement

I understand the risks of volunteering and will hold harmless and indemnify Upward Bound Camp, its officers, directors and employees from and against any loss, damage, liability, claims, cost and expense including legal fees which may be incurred by reason for the volunteer's participation in Upward Bound Camp programming, unless such claims are a result of the gross negligence or willful misconduct on the part of Upward Bound Camp.
